*A GRADE OF "C" OR BETTER MUST BE EARNED IN EACH OF THE TWO REQUIRED MATH COURSES IN ORDER TO FULFILL THE MATH REQUIREMENT AND IN ORDER TO ENROLL IN EACH AND EVERY SCHOOL OF BUSINESS JUNIOR-LEVEL AND SENIOR-LEVEL COURSE. ONLY 4 CREDIT HOURS WILL AWARDED FOR EACH REQUIRED MATH COURSE. AN AVERAGE OF AT LEAST A GRADE OF "C" MUST BE EARNED IN ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES I AND ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES II. +STUDENTS EXEMPT FROM MATH 010/ COLLEGE ALGEBRA II MUST COMPLETE A SUBSTITUTE COURSE (S) EQUIVALENT TO 4 CREDIT HOURS.

***International Business majors must complete a minimum of four semesters of a non-native foreign language, starting at level two or above, with one semester at the conversational level. IB majors who complete the conversational level in less than four semesters may choose to take another language until the four-semester foreign language minimum is completed.*

*** *International Business majors with a Functional Area Concentration in Finance must enroll in FINA 312 Business Finance.*
